Session 1: The Desert Fathers:

Retreat Leader: Dr. Brad Nassif

Brad Nassif grew up in St Mary's Orthodox Church in Wichita, his home parish. He is a graduate of St Vladimir's Orthodox Seminary and completed a doctorate in patristics at Fordham University under the late Fr John Meyendorff. He holds Masters' degrees from Denver Seminary (New Testament), Wichita State University (History) and a B.A. (Religion and Philosophy) from Friends University. Brad has been a Visiting Professor at Holy Cross Greek Orthodox Seminary, the Patriarch Athenagoras Orthodox Institute and evangelical seminaries across America. His books include The Evangelical Theology of the Orthodox Church, foreword by Fr Andrew Louth (SVS press, 2021); The Philokalia: A Classic Text of Orthodox Spirituality, foreword by Bishop Kallistos Ware (Oxford University Press); Bringing Jesus to the Desert; and New Perspectives on Historical Theology: Essays in Memory of John Meyendorff. Fr John McGuckin describes him as "the leading world-expert on the dialogue of the Orthodox Church with Evangelical Protestant traditions" (Faculty of Theology, Oxford University). Brad, Barbara (wife) and Melanie (daughter) are active parishioners at Holy Transfiguration Antiochian Church in Warrenville, Illinois.
